Professor Emmanuella Doussis holds diplomas from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (BA in political science and public administration, phd in international law) and Paris I, Panthéon-Sorbonne (DEA de droit international public et organisations internationales et DEA en droit de l'environnement). She has been visiting professor at the Universities of Bourgogne, Grenoble-Alpes and Aix-Marseille, and visiting fellow at the University of Geneva and European University Institute. She is currently the director of the Institute of European Integration and Policy and holds a UNESCO chair on climate diplomacy. She is a member of the IUCN World Environmental Law Committee, the ILA Committee on the role of international law in sustainable management of natural resources, the Greek National Committee for Adaptation to Climate Change and senior policy advisor of the Greek think tank ELIAMEP. She has published nine books, and numerous articles in peer-review journals. Her most recent book explores the role of international law in effectively managing climate change. Her research interests include sustainable development law and policies, international and European environmental law and policies, climate diplomacy, including the EU climate diplomacy, climate adaptation policies, settlement of disputes.
